#### PPL Rates Jump 23% in Past 6 Months

Recent Increase of 7% Occurred in December. Additional 16% Effective June 1.

The high cost of Pennsylvania's long-neglected energy infrastructure is coming due... and guess who is getting stuck with the bill?

In early May, PPL Electric Utilities announced that their rates will increase by nearly 16% starting June 1, 2025. Residential rates will jump from 10.77 cents per kilowatt hour to 12.49 cents. Small business rates are hiked from 10.45 cents per kilowatt hour to 12.11 cents.

This latest increase comes on the heels of a 7% increase enacted in December 2024. Total increases within six months: 23%! According to the Allentown-based power utility, factors driving the price hike are the closing of older power-generating plants and not enough new power plants being added to support Pennsylvania's ever-increasing need for 769860 electricity.

The trend of hefty cost increases being borne by electricity consumers is likely to continue into the next decade, according to James G. Deiter, President of Deiter Bros. Heating Cooling Energy of Bethlehem, PA. His firm is a leading Lehigh Valley-based provider of HVAC systems powered by multiple sources, including electricity, propane, natural gas and oil.

"Getting a new power generating plant online takes at least five years after all the planning, engineering, construction and regulatory requirements are met. And that's a natural gas-powered facility. A nuclear power plant takes considerably longer," he said. "Unless something extraordinary happens to inject new generating capacity into Pennsylvania's already overworked and aging power grid, I believe consumers should be prepared for substantial increases in their electric bills to continue until at least 2030."

#### Summer Safety Tips for Pets



Summertime heat can be tough on pets. Imagine facing the simmering temperatures of July and August wearing a fur coat day and night! To keep all our furry family members safe this summer, please follow these safety tips from our friends at the ASPCA.

• Have Plenty of Fresh, Clean Water. Always.

Dogs and cats get dehydrated very quickly in Lehigh Valley's summer heat and humidity. Make sure they have plenty of fresh, clean water 24/7. Also, when outdoors, make sure they have a shady place to stay out of the sun, be mindful not to over-exercise them, and keep them indoors when it's extremely hot.

- Watch for Symptoms of Overheating. Signs include excessive panting or difficulty breathing, increased heart or respiratory rate, drooling, stupor, or even collapse.
- Leaving Pets Locked in a Parked Vehicle is Cruel... AND Against the Law in Pennsylvania!
  PA Act 104 – also known as the Hot Car Law– states that owners cannot lock pets in hot cars. If law enforcement sees a pet locked in a hot car, the police are not liable for any damage to the motor vehicle or any contents during their rescue of the animal.
- Keep Pets Protected from the Sounds of Fireworks. Summer fireworks displays are fun for humans but very overstimulating for the acute hearing of dogs and cats. Loud, sudden noises can cause them pain and deep distress. They can become scared, disoriented or otherwise traumatized. Prevent friends or family members from using fireworks near your pets. Be aware of public fireworks displays in your community and do your best to keep 25321 pets safe from the noise in a quiet, sheltered (and escapeproof) area of your home.

#### EIA Expects Lower Oil Prices, Higher Natural Gas Prices Through 2026

May 6, 2025 — The US Energy Information Administration (EIA) recently released its Short Term Energy Outlook which expects recent developments in global trade policy and oil production to lower global demand for petroleum products, including heating oil, resulting 267947 in lower oil prices than it had previously forecast.

EIA also forecasts natural gas prices to *increase significantly* from historic lows in 2024.

The EIA Short Term Energy Outlook included the following three-year price tracking which includes projections for the remainder of 2025 and all of 2026.
