Some analysts believe as much as 60% of the recent price increases are due to market speculation.

There are a number of reasons for oil price escalation, but one that our government can quickly fix is due to investors flocking to oil and creating ARTIFICIAL DEMAND for the commodity, which drives up the price.

Hey, instead of spending our tax dollars on a bureaucratic inquiry, the Feds should've called me and I could have told them the same thing...and I work for a lot less! # Farmer's Almanac Predicts **BIG CHILL** For This Winter



The weather forecasters at the Farmer's Almanac have chalked up a pretty good batting average

since they began publishing in 1792, stating in their 2009 issue that the previous year's predictions proved "90 percent accurate in predicting whether there would be more or less precipitation than in the previous winter. On average, our forecast winter temperatures were within one degree of actual temperatures." (Gee...now if only they could predict energy prices.)

If these weather wizards are correct in their forecasts, we're in for an unusually cold and snowy winter. They base their predictions on a bunch of factors but the overriding one seems to be solar activity cycles. According to their studies, we are at the beginning of a period of significant change that belies the popular theory of global warming.

Their researchers note: "Over the coming years, a gradual cooling of the atmosphere will occur. Most of the nation will have below-normal winter temperatures, on average. The area of heavy snowfall will extend from the Ozarks northeastward into southern New England."

Hmmm...I checked my map and our Lehigh Valley is right smack in the pathway of this snowy steamroller that they are predicting. 124610 And they are calling for this Big Chill of lower temps and higher snowfalls to be pretty consistent from November through March.

Here's what Farmer's Almanac is calling for in our Lehigh Valley on a month-by-month basis:

#### January ••••••

New Year's Day will be a good day to nurse your hangover and watch football as rains turn the Lehigh Valley into a giant slushball. Around the 4th the snow machine turns on again and temperatures drop into the deep freeze with some relief coming mid-month with milder temps and rain with another snowfall happening between the 25th and 28th. wearing" the latest in layered fashions indoors this winter. Last heating season, several of our customers lowered their thermostats to the mid 60 degree range, layered on some extra duds, and we tracked their fuel usage. Guess what? These frugal folks cut their fuel usage on average over 10 to 15%! This winter, set the House Rules and save with LOWER DOWN! LAYER ON!

DO THE MONEY SAVING MATH: According to the

Alliance to Save Energy (www.ase.org) for every degree you lower your home's thermostat during the heating season, you can cut your bill by up to 5%. You'll be a little coola...but save a ton of moola!

(Which means, basically, that for every dollar she was spending on oil she was getting back 65 cents worth of heat. Bad trade.) Well, we gave it a thorough cleaning and a tune-up and her efficiency level flew back up to 85%, which is the highest level achievable with her unit, according to manufacturer specifications.

### COOLER TECHNOLOGY: THE OUTDOOR RESET

With oil prices so high, a lot of techno tricks are being used to have heating systems work only as hard as they have to. One of these is called an "outdoor reset" and while we heating guys know about these proven fuel savers, most consumers do not...yet. Remember: on warmer days, your boiler

doesn't have to run as much. But your boiler doesn't know what the outside temperature is, so it fires up oftentimes more than it has to. Without getting too technical, an outdoor reset is basically



(A.) a thermostatic sensor mounted outside your house which is connected to (B.) a small microprocessor which interprets the outdoor temperature changes and (C.) signals the boiler to fire only as needed to keep the water flowing through your heating system at a comfortable level. An outdoor reset will also minimize boiler short

# And Here Are More Ways to Save: Deiter Bros.

CHEAPSKATE CHECKLIST

During times like this, being a cheapskate can be a very good thing. So along with our 6 Savers list rankings, we offer the following Cheapskate Checklist. All of these are legitimate energy savers. And most are pretty easy to achieve. How many items on our list have you done...or will do before winter hits?

- Caulk and weatherstrip around windows and doors to stop air leaks
- Seal gaps in the floor and walls around pipes and electrical wiring
- Change air filters monthly
- Replace incandescent bulbs with compact fluorescentsthey use 75 % less energy and last 10 times longer
- Install aerating, low-flow faucets and showerheads
- Fix any leaky faucets- one drop per second can add up to 165 gallons a month
- Tune-up your heating and cooling system annually to keep it running as efficiently as possible
- Have your ductwork inspected and repair any leaks
- Add insulation to your attic, crawl space and any accessible exterior walls
- Wrap your water heater with insulation or install an insulating blanket
- Look for the ENERGY STAR label when replacing large or small appliances
  - energy
- Use power strips for home electronics and turn off power strips when equipment is not in use
- Replace worn-out seals on your refrigerator and freezer
- Reduce hot water use by taking shorter showers and using cold water for the rinse cycle in your washer
  - ) Turn off lights, televisions and other appliances when not in use

# CHEAPSKATE CHECKLIST

- Clean refrigerator coils regularly to keep compressor running efficiently
- Set the refrigerator temperature at 36° to 39° F and Freezer at 0° to 5° F
- Use the microwave when possible it cooks faster and doesn't create as much heat as a stove burner
- Air-dry dishes instead of using the dishwasher's heat drying option



- Run your dishwasher and clothes washer only when full
- Match the size of your pot or pan to the size of the burner
- Make sure your dryer's outside vent is clear and clean the lint filter after every load



- Keep all windows and doors located near your thermostat closed tightly
  - tat
- Keep heat sources such as lamps and appliances away from your thermostat
- Consider replacing your older model refrigerator, especially if older than 10 years, with an ENERGY STAR refrigerator
- Install foam gaskets behind electricoutlet and switch-plate covers
- Dry one load of clothes immediately after another to minimize heat loss



- Defrost frozen food in the refrigerator before cooking 78940
- Use the oven light to check on progress when cooking or baking.
- Keep your outside air conditioning unit clean and clear of debris or weeds
- Use low-watt bulbs where lighting is not critical
- Place floor lamps and hanging lamps in corners. The reflection off the walls will give you more light
- Turn off outdoor lighting during the day. Try timer switches or photoelectric controls if the finger method is a bother

cycling (when it fires up and then shuts down within a few seconds) which is a 76051 real efficiency killer.

Downside on outdoor resets: they only work on boilers (hydronic) systems...those which heat the home with hot water circulating through pipes to radiators or baseboards. If you have a furnace or warm air system, this technology isn't your thing. Upside on outdoor resets: If you have a boiler that heats your home with hot water, one of these gizmos can save you a boatload of dough over the course of the year...much more over several heating seasons. My daughter refers to the "olden days" as about 15 years ago. My own definition goes back to the Pittsburgh Steelers "Steel Curtain" era of the 1970s. My Dad's idea of the olden days were somewhere around the Eisenhower administration. Because this newsletter is all about saving you fuel dollars, let's just consider the olden days as the time before heating fuel prices got scary. Fair enough?

Back in those days of yore, heating systems HAD to be big enough to heat the whole house at one time. Remember: families were bigger and fuel was cheaper, most systems only had one zone "thermostat". Nowadays, most newly built houses are divided into several ZONES. Heat can be sent to each zone separately, i.e. if someone is in the guest room for the weekend, you can turn on that zone, if it's empty, turn it down...why pay for heat no one is using?

If you have an older home, you may have only one zone, so you are heating your whole house all the time. But we can fix that for you by dividing your home into zones, each served by controls on your heating system that can be turned on or off at the thermostat. Zoning is a great fuel saving strategy, particularly for older, larger homes. Zoning will work on both warm air and hydronic systems. The cost is a bit pricier than our other 6 Savers because there are some controls and labor involved to install a zoned system (it's definitely not a job for do-ityourselfers) and that's why we rate it at two dollar signs in our Cost To Return Ratio. But, as any heating pro knows, getting in the zone will definitely save you money over the long haul.

Costs a bit to have a zoned system installed properly but the investment will definitely come back to you in fuel savings, season after season.
